PRICEVILLE

Two old highlanders were once boasting of the sharpness of their countrymen, the one a Mull man and the other an Ilay man, and this is the way they tested one another's countrymen in their own language. The Mull man first said: Cha bhà an cal nan cullach nach fàich tannil a Mhùilich, but the Ilay man hesitated a little and said cha bhà an ardan isal nach fàich tannil an iolach. Those who can read these sayings will understand best. The Mull man's phrase was that the Mull man could see everything on the level or inside the house, but the Ilay man said his countrymen could see away up high and what was going on downwards. So we must admit that the Iolach came out best, although naturally we would give the other fellow the preference.

It's now jingle, jingle all the way, 'Tis a merry, merry sleigh. The automobile will be safely housed and unfed till next summer. Those who were scared to take the main roads will now be permitted to go as they please, for they can either take high roads or low roads going to Priceville or Durham.

It is said that it is easy to know a country man when he comes to town, for he forgets but the streets are the sidewalks and concessions and so he takes the middle of the street, but fortunately we have no police in Priceville, or else they would enforce the citizens to keep the sidewalks clear of snow, for we saw the other day down on our station the sidewalks as the snow sowed them with snow.

We notice a lot of sheep yet feeding themselves by pawing away the snow. A good natured highlander was telling of his experience hunting his sheep over his hilly farm when the first heavy fall of snow came. Not being possessed with eloquence in the English language, he mixed it up by saying part in English and in Gaelic. He said: "I was rurch over the Cnocan and I could not find the caora dhubh and then chaid mi sìos in the hollow and no caora dhubh could I find." So the readers will translate what they don't understand the best way they can.

Down at the corner of D. McInnes' farm at Bunnessan, now Mr. Brown's, a big elm tree stood long years ago and it was said it could be seen with a spying glass from the town of Walkerton, but the old tree is gone and rotted away long ago. Away up in the Stone settlement not many miles from this town there is a tower, for what object we do not know.
