### Japan and China

Eyer since the occupation by Japan of Kiao-chau, the former German territory in China, negotiations have been proceeding between the Japanese and Chinese Governments. The exact nature of the demands which Japan made npon China is not known but they were undoubtedly pretty stiff. They are said to have included the transfer to Japan of German rights in the Shantung Peninsula, the granting of important commercial railrond and mining privileges, an undertaking to employ Japanese subjects as advisers in administrative, financial and military affairs, and a promise not to alienate or lease to other countries any port, harbor or island on the coast of China China protested against the character of the Japanese demands, but it is said that these have since been modified and that there is now a better prospect of an amicable settlement.
