BY-LAW NUMBER 304 of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Egremont.

A By-law to take the vote of the ratepayers of the Police Village of Holstein in the Township of Egremont entitled to vote on money By-laws on a question to be submitted whether the said ratepayers are in favor of a supply of electric power from the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Egremont deems it advisable to submit the ratepayers of the Police Village of Holstein in the Township of Egremont, entitled to vote on money By-laws a question as to whether the said ratepayers are in favor of a supply of electric power from the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

1. That for the purposes aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Council of the said Municipal Corporation to borrow a sum of \$3,000, and to issue debentures of the amount, to be paid by the sum of \$300, each of which debenture shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof, and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter at the Office of the Hydro of Montreal at the said Police Village of Holstein in the Township of Egremont enacted as follows:

2. Each of the said debentures shall be signed by the Reeve of the Police Village of Holstein and by the Treasurer thereof and the Clerk of the said Township of Egremont shall attest thereto the Corporate Seal of the said Municipality.

3. The said debentures shall bear interest, at the rate of five and one-half per cent per annum, payable yearly at the office of the said Bank of Montreal at the Police Village of Holstein and shall have attached thereto coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer of the said Township of Egremont.

4. During the currency of the said debentures there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the Police Village of Holstein, a sum of \$251.04 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the years from the date of issue in respect of the said debt (as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed).

D. 1915, the Reeve of the said Township of Egremont shall attend at the Clerk's Office at the said Township of Egremont at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon to appoint persons to attend at the Polling Place aforesaid and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk of this Corporation and the person to attend interested in and desirous of the said polling place on behalf of the electors interested in and desirous of the answering of the question in the affirmative and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the answering of the question in the negative respectively.

8. The Clerk of the Council of the said Township of Egremont shall attend at his office in the said Township of Egremont at ten o'clock in the forenoon of Saturday the 28th day of August A. D. 1915, to sum up the number of votes for and against this By-law.

9. The 28th day of August, A. D. 1915, at the Clerk's Office in the Township of Egremont at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, is hereby appointed for the summing up by the Clerk of the said Corporation of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative respectively.

D. 1915, the Reeve of the said Township of Egremont shall attend at the Clerk's Office at the said Township of Egremont at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon to appoint persons to attend at the Polling Place aforesaid and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this By-law respectively.

11. The Clerk of the Council of the said Township of Egremont shall attend at his office in the said Township of Egremont at ten o'clock in the forenoon of Saturday the 28th day of August A. D. 1915, to sum up the number of votes for and against this By-law.

RE-LAW NUMBER 305
of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Egremont.

A By-law to authorize the borrowing of

sum of \$3,000 by the issue and sale of Debentures to provide for the cost of a plant to distribute electric power to be supplied by the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario at the Police Village of Holstein, in the Municipality of the Township of Egremont.

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable and necessary to raise by way of loan on the credit of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Egremont the sum of \$3,000 to provide for the cost of works, plant, machinery and apparatus necessary for the distribution of electric power in the said Police Village of Holstein in the Municipality of the Township of Egremont.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the said debentures at one time and to the principal of the said debt repayable by way of instalments during the period of twenty years being the currency of said debentures, said yearly sum being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest on account of the said debt shall as nearly as possible equal the amount so payable each of the other nineteen years of said period (as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed.)

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be repaid annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinbefore provided is the sum of \$251.04.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole ratable property of the said Township of Egremont according to the last revised assessment roll thereof is the sum of \$1,930,712

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality of the Township of Egremont exclusive of local improvement

debt secured by special rates or assessments is the sum of \$1,000, whereof no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

WHEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Egremont enacts as follows:

1. That for the purposes aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Council of the said Municipal Corporation to borrow a sum of \$3,000, and to issue debentures of the amount, to be paid by the sum of \$300, each of which debenture shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof, and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter at the Office of the Hydro of Montreal at the said Police Village of Holstein in the Township of Egremont enacted as follows:
