Distribution of Seed Grain and Potatoes

From the Dominion Experimental Farms, 1916-1918

By instructions of the Hon. Minister of Agriculture, a free distribution of superior sorts of grain and potatoes will be made during the coming winter and spring to Canadian farmers. The samples will consist of spring wheat (about 5 lbs.), white oats (about 4 lbs.), barley (about 5 lbs.), and field peas (about 5 lbs.). These will be sent out from Ottawa.

A distribution of potatoes (in 3 lb. samples) will be carried out from several of the Experimental Farms, the Central Farm at Ottawa supplying only the provinces of Ontario and Quebec.

Each application must be separate and must be signed by the applicant. Only one sample of grain and one of potatoes can be sent to each farm. If both samples are asked for in the same letter only one will be sent. Applications on any kind of printed form cannot be accepted.

The destruction of fire of the cereal building at Ottawa, which contained grain-cleaning machinery and a large stock of seed grain for distribution may make it necessary to curtail the distribution to a certain extent. We shall fill as many as possible of the applications which conform to the rules, but requests received after the end of December will probably be totale. Samples cannot be sent in response to applications (no matter when received) which fail to state clearly the needs of the applicant, his experiences in crop raising, and the character of the soil on which he intends to sow the seed.

All applications for grain (and applications for the provinces of Ontario and Quebec for potatoes) should be addressed to the Dominion Cereals, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa. Such applications require no postage. If otherwise addressed, delay and disappointment may occur.

Applications for potatoes from farmers in any other province should be addressed (postage prepaid) to the Superintendent of the nearest branch Experimental Farm in that province. J. H. GRISDALE, Director, Dem. Exper. Farms.

Another name which must be added to the Roll of Honor is that of Herbert McLeod, who enlisted in Toronto some time ago, and whose name was omitted in last week's list. This last bunch makes fifteen recruits from Flesheron.—Flesheron Advance.

WHAT THE JAIL RECORDS SHOW.—The statistics of the Walkerton jail reveal that the bachelors and bachelorettes in Bruce were equally bad during the past year and that just as many of the one got into jail as the other. And with the stabber it is worse, the wedded variety getting pinched oftener than the unclaimed virgin. But where our law blows off is that the Methodists needed police attention oftener than any other Protestant denomination, no less than 10 of this persuasion being jailed for crime. The fact that each prisoner was fed for less than 10c a day suggests that they didn't have any fruit out of season, or that the tables didn't exactly groan under the weight of the luxuries served up. But yet some of those gents came out fatter than mud and looking for all the world as if they had gorged until their sides ached. As stall-fed animals, however, are generally fat, it may be that the inactivity of the prisoners helps the jailer out in putting down the grease. Be this as it may, Governor McKechnie is in a class by himself when it comes to making human hard-pails cheap.—Walkerton Times.

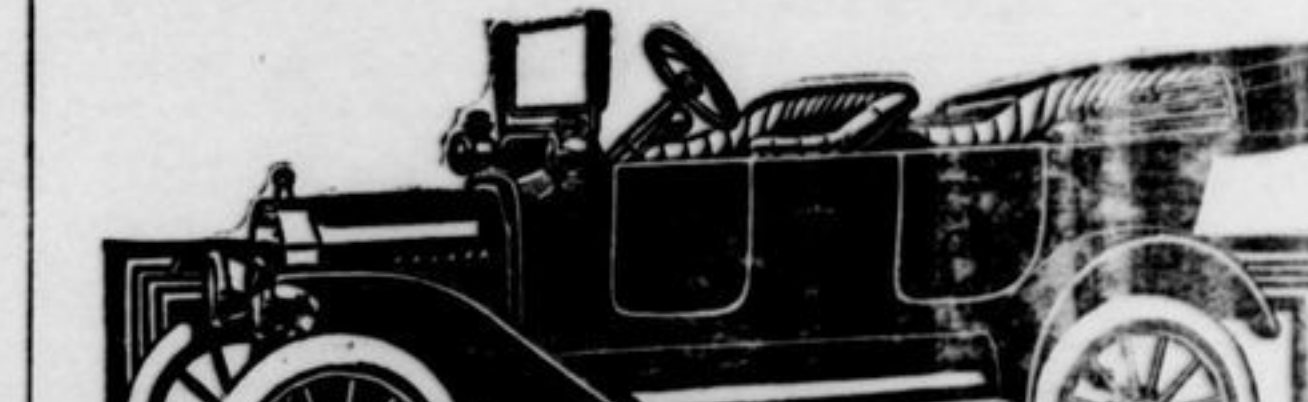
