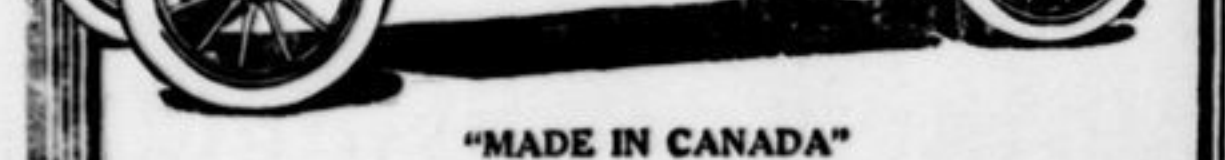

All the people at Poynton are well and just as decent to me as ever. Any time I am in England I shall certainly make Poynton my headquarters.

I came back from England with my pack full of knick knacks which I have been wanting for ages.

Christmas will be here before we know what is happening and in all likelihood we shall be in the trenches sending across some 300 souvenirs to the Germans.

County Council

Ayton a Police Village

Owen Sound papers say Co. Council had a fairly busy week, though nothing very startling occupied their attention.

A by-law was passed making Ayton a police village with three Trustees but no revenue, the chief object being to enable the village to levy rates for fire protection.

A resolution was passed asking the three members of the Legislature for the county to urge upon the government the passing of an act to compel owners of waste and pasture land to treat them with a preparation to exterminate the grasshopper pest.

The Warden and Messrs Ryan and Leslie were appointed a committee to present an illuminated address to Mr Jno. Rathbone.

Treasurer Parker reported on the financial condition of the County and asked a salary of \$200 for the Deputy-Treasurer.

Warden Calder entertained the members at an informal "At Home" on Friday evening.
