The Late Mr C. C. James The death of this gentleman has stirred Priceville and neighborhood as few deaths have done. An acquaintance of 47 years led us to form a high opinion of his character and public spiritedness, and we join with the many friends, who, in the trying hour extend sympathy to the daughters. His home life, even under trying afflictions, was beautiful; his public career was worthy of emulation, his devotion to the higher things of life was an example that will always furnish a precious memory to his loved ones. Our regular correspondents and Mrs N. McKinnon do justice to his memory. Mrs. McKinnon says: The name of C. C. James has been pre eminently associated with Priceville and its early history, he being one of its first settlers and was a name which always added a touch of dignity and respect to any organization to which he belonged, whether social, religious or as a citizen. He was a man of high ideals, a lover of music and art and a most loyal supporter of what seemed to him calculated as an uplift to the community. His devotion to family and home was a prominent feature in his character. His children, bereft of their mother very early in life, found in him an affectionate and rare regard, which continued to the end. His father was postmaster of Woodbridge (away back in the early 50's) known then as Berwick. From there they moved to Onio, where in a short time father, a brother and a cousin, who resided with them, all died in the space of 3 or 4 years from Malaria. Dr. Mahaffy, an uncle, at this time was practising in Orange Valley and knowing of the reverses with which his sister's family had met, sent for them to return to Canada. Mr James began his life's work as a teacher at Burgoyne, Ont., later came to Priceville and established the Tannery, which he carried on successfully for several years. He is survived by Mrs Bows of Markdale, Miss Jennie (invalid from rheumatism for 10 years), Bertha, Edith and Mrs Herman McLellan of this place, to whom the sympathy of all is extended. Wreaths from members of the Methodist church, A. O. U. W. and the family testified to the high esteem in which he was held.

He leaves to mourn him five daughters, his only son having died some years ago when quite a young man. It seemed to fall to his lot to have a great deal of trouble but like a true soldier of the Cross that he was, bore it with patience and fortitude. Mr D G McLean is seriously ill with congestion of the lungs and as Mr McLean has been a sufferer from asthma for some years, the disease will be greatly aggravated.
