Natural comfort is what the breeders want, and the more naturally it can appear to be, the better do they like it. When the chicken grower begins to look at the handling of his birds in such a way that he supplies their comforts and not his own convenience, he has made a big stride toward getting results. If the birds can be brought to a state of perfection that will bring good strong germs, conditions must be carefully watched, for if that condition becomes impaired, it is going to be extremely hard to bring them back before the season is well advanced. If then we want extra early chicks, and we find our birds in particularly good fit, then is the time to get the chicks out. 




