## An Old Soldier.



THE WAYS OF CRABS.

Philippine Islands, uncovered at low tide, there are often to be seen huge numbers of the grayish-blue crabs called Myctiris. The body has the shape and size of a cherry, and the legs are set close. Dr. R. P. Cowles has given us a lovely picture of the ways of these creatures.

They move about like diminutive armies, and, though the individuals seem to be scrambling along rather awkwardly.

But what is most remarkable their power of intrenching themselves with extraordinary rapidity. At one moment there are tens of thousands on the sand; the next moment there are none.

By approaching very slowly and carefully, Dr. Cowles was able to see what happened. When he got near enough and stamped with his foot, every crab dug into the sand with the legs of one side, and at the same time rotated its body so that it sank out of sight in a spiral.

In two or three seconds the army had buried itself. After a few minbegan to dig themselves out again and, reforming their ranks, resumed their march.
