**The Week in the Legislature**

**Agriculture**—Mr. Parliament, Liberal, P. E. County, is a practical farmer and urged in a spirited manner a system of rural credits and other matter in the farmers' interest.

**Prohibition**—A deputation from the liquor interests waited on the Premier but got little encouragement. It is expected that Prohibition will be enacted this session, without a referendum. Some Conservatives will oppose it, but the rest and the Liberals will carry it.

**Government House**—This question provides the chief excitement of the week. The Liberals as usual opposed grants to the million and a quarter dollar estate. With a vote about to be taken the discovery was made that the Liberals were in a majority and excitedly the Conservatives present spoke against time to allow of bringing in the careless absent ones from downtown.

**Hydro Accts.**—The Provincial Auditor criticized severely the Hydro accounts. "Not even a semblance of Legislative control of Expenditure of the Hydro Commission" he says, "Defiant disobedience of the Act." Time to investigate when the non-partisan official makes such charges. Mr. Rowell made some trenchant criticism.

**McDonald, of Bruce**, again brought in the Women's Suffrage bill, but Premier Hearst opposed it and down it went in spite of the example of the Western provinces and the self-sacrificing services of the women of the country which might have been rewarded by granting the vote.

Mr. Rowell urged the claims of returned soldiers and asked Mr. Hearst if he was doing anything in that direction. The reply was non-committal. S. Ducharme, the French Liberal from N. Essex, gave an eloquent speech, urging whole hearted co-operation of both French and English in the war.

**Dominion Alliance Convention, Massey Hall**

Toronto, March 23rd, 29th, 30th, 1916

The Annual Convention of the Ontario Branch of the Dominion Alliance has been growing in interest from year to year and the indications are that the attendance next week will break all previous records. Already inquiries regarding rates of Railway travel and program of Convention are coming into the office of the Alliance from all parts of the Province. Perhaps never before was temperance sentiment at such a white heat and the people everywhere want to know just what has been done and what is likely to be done this year.

A reference to the program shows that every minute of the three days' Convention from 9 a. m. until 10 p. m. will be occupied. Prominent speakers of Province wide fame will be present, representing the W. C. T. U., the Sons of Temperance, the R. T. of Temperance, the I. O. Good Templars and the churches Anglican, Baptist, Congregational, Methodist, Presbyterian, Roman Catholic, the Y. P. S. C. E. and the Catholic Total Abstinence Society.

In addition the names of Prof. T. H. Cotton, M. A., B. D., Rev. Dr. A. Grant, G. A. Warburton, Esq., Major (Rev. Dr.) Williams, Hon. Chas. H. Macell, M. P., H. H. Stevens, Esq., M. P., Joseph Gibson Esq., and others appear at intervals throughout the program.

Among distinguished speakers from the United States is Hon. Wayne B. Wheeler of Washington D. C., National Attorney Anti Saloon League of America who appears for the first time on an Ontario platform. The two great American Prohibition Campaigners Hall and Summers also appear for the first time in this province.

Probably the most effective up-to-date campaign novelty in the big prohibition fight in the States is the now celebrated dialogue debate "Wet vs Dry," by Hall and Summers. They will give it in Toronto.

They carried every county in Michigan of which they had charge. "If they don't stop this team, they'll make the United States as dry as a desert" are some press opinions.

On the whole the program is an attractive one and much will depend on the conclusions of this Prohibition Parliament as to the future status of the drink traffic in the Province.

While the Convention covers but three days, March 28th, 29th, 30th, railway tickets are good going on March 24th and returning up to and including April 4th, for a single fare, certificate plan. This will no doubt bring many visitors in addition to the regularly elected delegates.
