Dear Mrs Haight: It is my sad duty to inform you that Lance Corporal J W Halliday,
No 461280 of the 44th Canadian Infantry was killed in action on Feb 3rd

I can tell you this that so splendid was the conduct of our men that they were warmly congratulated by their officers commanding and later received the thanks of the Brigadier—unfortunately a number fell.
