Jubilee Year of the Dominion

It seems a hard fate that the Jubilee period of our Dominion, which in peace times would be a time of celebrations and rejoicing, should arrive when all thoughts are turned to war and its hideous results, when thousands in our Dominion are mourning for loved ones maintained for life or that will never return.

Yet in this school of suffering there are lessons to be learned. Our thoughts take on a more heroic mould, they are turned away from self, and sympathetic consideration for the good of others is forced upon us. In the midst of it all we are comforted for we have the assurance "Weeping may endure for a night but joy cometh in the morning."

On the 1st of July 1867 this Dominion came officially into being. There has been bitter political struggles for years before. Party feeling, bitter enough in our own day sometimes, runs much higher then. So bitter and unbending was it that a "deadlock" occurred, and then was witnessed that blending of the parties called "coalition" that brought about union of feeling and the adoption of the Federal principle as seen in our Dominion.

May we hope that the sons of the fathers of those days may, in an even greater crisis, be imbued with the example of 50 years ago, and prove to the world once more that in Union there is Strength, and start Canada off on her second 50 years with the consciousness of a great and harmonious future.
