

DRIED VEGETABLES

New Process.

Russian laborers who are building the railroad from Petrograd to Kalo, the arctic port on the White Sea, are living largely on dried vegetables. The evaporating plants, which are usually run only to dry apples, are equally serviceable in the preservation of onions

carrots, cabbages and small fruits. The principle of removing water from vegetables without cooking them and without changing their food content or physical structure has recently been successfully worked out. The water is gradually withdrawn from the peeled, sliced or shredded vegetables by passing over them expanded air a comparatively low temperatures.
