Prophecy of Flying of 200 Years Ago. Inasmuch as the words were uttered more than two centuries ago, there was a truly prophetic anticipation of the experience of the present war in a sermon on "physio-theology," delivered in 1711, by Dr. William Delham, of St. John's College, Oxford, which has just come to light again. "As in all probability the art of flying would particularly be," he said, "by putting it in man's power to discover the secret of nations and families more than is consistent with the peace of the world to know; by giving ill men greater opportunities to do mischief which it would not lie in the power of others to prevent; and, as one observes, by making men less sociable."
