





SMASHING A SUBMARINE.

The newest contrivance for smashing a submarine is a bomb loaded with a huge charge of "T.N.T." and hanging from a float.

Suppose the "sub" to be located while travelling under water, by observation from an airplane or balloon. Seen from aloft it is a moving shadow resembling a gigantic fish. Under such circumstances, of

course, it is blind. It does not know that danger threatens. But meanwhile the patrol boats gather and prepare to do some fishing. The U-boat, under water, cannot travel faster than twelve miles an

hour at the utmost. Very likely it is going at a much slower rate. To drop a bomb in front of it is an easy mat-

wire of any desired length, say fifty feet, if that be the supposed depth at which the "sub" is moving. When it has sunk that far the resistance of the float yanks a plug out of it, thereby causing it to explode. This idea was originated by Sperry,
