Summing up he said we must conduct the war with all vigor, it means more men and as well conscription of war-profiteering profits. Soldiers must be more liberally paid, increased pay, but not too much, had been given to dependents.

Mr Slaght plunged right in on arrival and marked by his address, he was warmly welcomed. He is a fluent, forceful speaker, fortified with facts and quotations and made a splendid impression.

It became obvious, he said, to Sir Robt Borden in May last that the country was dissatisfied with his government. No wonder. He ran the war as a partisan measure. Borden and his French members did not make a single recruiting speech before May 1917.

Borden, the Tory Leader drafted the machinery of the Mil. F. Act so generally condemned and had the Union government been formed without Borden it would have met universal endorsement.

He took up the three Wesley's quoting Shakespeare "What is in a name?" The 1st was Col. John Wesley Allison, the friend of Sam Hughes who got away with the million dollar steal, giving his type, Wesley Flavelle, and the steal he had made of 80 per cent profit according to the OC report.
