Coal on the Prairies.

According to estimates prepared by experts there is enough soft coal in the four Western Provinces of Canada to supply the world for a couple of centuries. The mines of Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia have scarcely been tapped, but have produced a total in one year of 6,000,-000 tons, to the value of over 25 million dollars. The coal is of very good grade, and is equally serviceable for steam purposes and household heating. The Canadian Dominion geological survey has estimated that the coal beds contain a total of 143,490,000,000
