Township Hall, February 10th, 1919. Minutes of last meeting were read and adopted. McDonald-Hewitson: That members of this Council desire to express...

Hunt-Hudson: That as there is an agitation by motorists to increase the speed limit to 25 miles, we enter protest against the action as the present speed limit is as fast as is safe for the travelling public.

Hunt-McDonald: That By-law No. 29 be amended by inserting in place of \$125 for Collector's salary the sum of \$145. The extras appearing in minutes of last meeting were for the Treasurer, preparing financial statement and Clerk registration fees.

Applications for Assessor were received from Messrs. W. S. Willis, M. Jacklin and T. Raeburn. Hunt-Hudson: That W. S. Willis be appointed Assessor and By-law drafted confirming same.—Carried.

Hunt-Hewitson: That Reeves report re damages sustained by Mr. Philip Schmidt to horse and rig, amounting to \$10, be paid.—Carried. Hudson-Hewitson: That tender of G. H. Mitchell for printing be accepted.—Carried.

McDonald-Hewitson: That Thomas Raeburn be refunded \$2 dog tax.—Carried. Hunt-McDonald: That H. W. Hunt pay to Treasurer \$2 for timber sold on Base Line.—Carried.
