**Saugeen Presbytery**

The Presbytery of Saugeen held a rather busy and important meeting at Palmerston on Tuesday.

The Rev. R. J. Sturgeon, of Melville and Bethel churches was elected moderator for the ensuing year.

Routine reports were received from the Home Mission, Budget, and Statistical Committees.

The call extended by Knox Church, Palmerston, to the Rev. Mr. Konkle was sustained and the call forwarded. It was signed by 221 members and 42 adherents.

Previous action regarding the union of Knox and Guthrie churches in Harrison was reversed. Guthrie Church asked permission to remain as a separate congregation, and the request was granted on the understanding that no aid would be given from the church funds. Rev. R. J.

Sturgeon was appointed interim moderator of session.

Rev. J. H. Graham resigned the charge of Cedarville and Explan congregations. Mr. Graham has lost one son in the war and another has been very ill, so that he considers it his duty to be with his family on the farm near Stratford. The resignation was accepted to take effect the end of March. Rev. S. H. Moyer of Conn. was appointed interim moderator of session.

The Forward Movement was taken up. In that connection an address was given by Mrs. Macgillivray, wife of the Rev. Dr. Donald Macgillivray, the Chinese missionary and scholar, to the W. M. S. of Knox Church and Presbytery participated. It was decided to have an interchange of pulpits on the third Sabbath of May and following that the conferences in districts of the Presbytery. One of them will probably be in Mt. Forest or Holstein.
