Extravagant Use of Straw. The use of at least a limited amount of bedding for beef cattle is advisable, but the extravagant use of straw, coarse hays, etc., for this purpose should be discouraged. All such roughages that are to be used for bedding, either for fattening or breeding animals, should first be offered them in the hay rack and that which is refused used for bedding. If stover is fed the stalks, while somewnat difficult to handle, make satisfactory bedding material and should be used for this purpose rather than burned or otherwise disposed of.
