

# Some of the Heroes from Durham and South Grey who made the in the Great War.—“They Gave Their To-day for Our To-morrow.”—In Remembrance, Empire Day,



**Pte. John Weir**

Son of Mr. William Weir, Guelph, killed in action Sept. 26, 1916. He was among the first to enlist in Durham, in January 1915.



**Pte. Percy Bryon**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. John Bryon, Durham, killed in action, Sept. 1916, aged 20 years. He enlisted in January 1915.



**Gunnér Percy McKechnie**

Eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Dugald McKechnie, Durham, wounded Sept. 8th, 1918, and died same day, aged 20 years. Enlisted March 1st, 1917, in 6th battery, Guelph.



**Pte. Thos. W. McDonald**

Son of Mr. A. C. McDonald, Durham now in New Ont., who died in London, Eng., military hospital Dec. 9th, 1918, aged 35 yrs., as result of gas and nerve shock. He enlisted in the West in 1915.



**Gunnér Roy G Calder**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Calder, Durham, who made the supreme sacrifice Sept. 16th, 1918, aged 23 years. He enlisted in Dec 1915, with the 29th battery, Guelph.



**Pilot J Foster Saunders**

Son of Mr. S P Saunders, Durham, killed while flying at Camp Borden June 17th, 1918, aged 26 years. Before joining the Royal Air Force, Pilot Saunders was engaged for several months in the Canadian naval service.



**Pte. Jesse Hughes**

Of Durham killed in action Sept. 30, 1918, aged 41 years. He was born in England and came to Durham 11 years previous to his death. His wife and two daughters are still resident here.



**Pte. Wm. T. McAlister**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. T. McAlister, Normanby, enlisted in Nov. 1915, in the West, reported missing Sept. 28th, 1916, aged 24 years. At end of 1917, his parents received definite word from a chum that he had been killed in action.



**Pte. Roy Eccles**

Eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Major Eccles, North Egremont, wounded at Passchendaele Nov. 1917, and died of wounds Nov. 26th, 1917, at Rouen hospital, aged 23 years. He enlisted in the 147th batt.



**Lce.-Corp Wes. Manary**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. John Manary of Holstein, wounded Oct. 30, died of wounds Oct 31st, 1917. He enlisted in Winnipeg in March 1916.



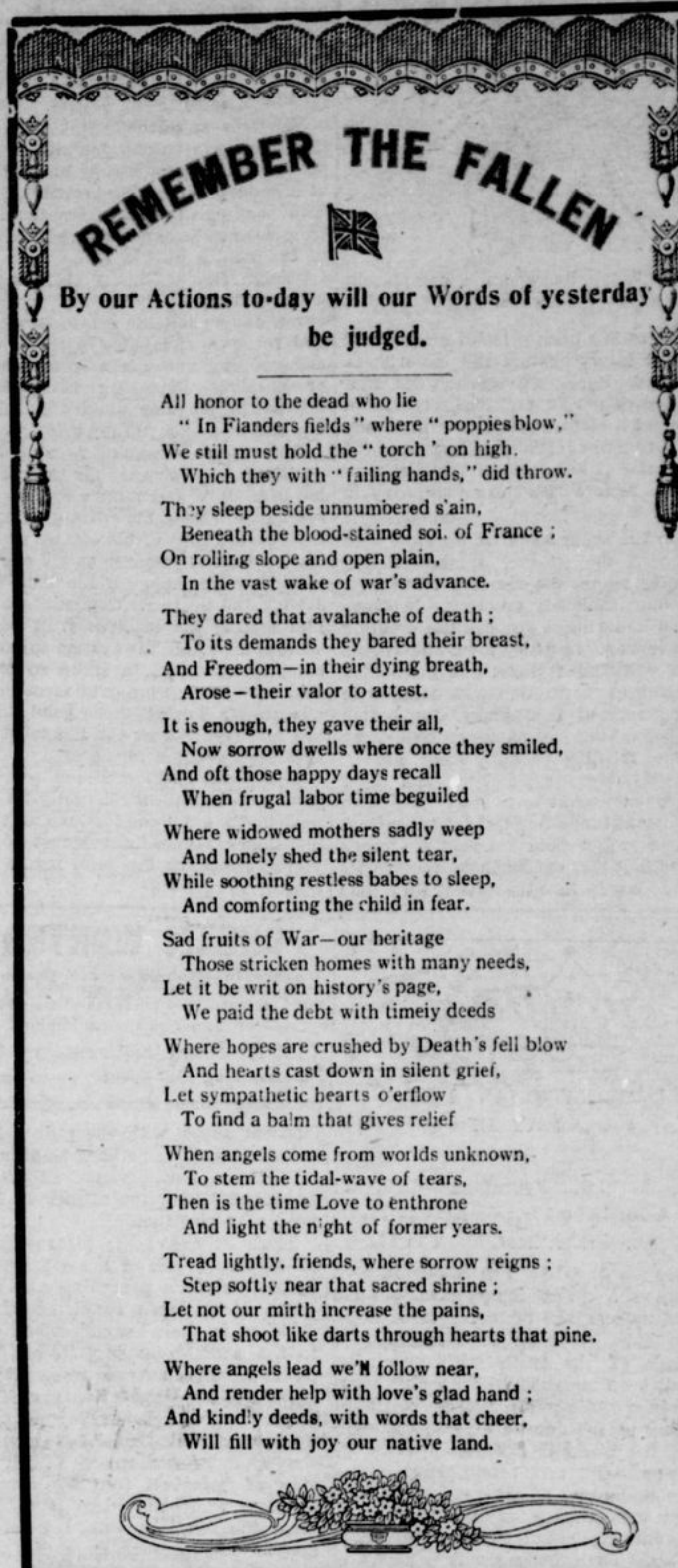
**Pte. Wm. R. Falkingham**

Killed in action July 23rd, 1917, aged 24 years. He was the son of Mr. W. L. Falkingham and enlisted Aug 10, 1914, six days after declaration of war.



**Pte. Wm. Gadd**

Son of Mrs. Adam Watson, Lambton st., killed in action March 16th, 1918, aged 26 years. He enlisted in Toronto in July 1915.

**Pte. John M. Ledingham**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Jas. Ledingham, Dornoch, killed in action Oct. 26, 1917, aged 21 years. He enlisted with his elder brother George (now returned) (at right) in 147th batt in May 1916.

**Lieut. Stanley McNally**

Second son of Mr. and Mrs. Jas. McNally, Lambton st., who enlisted in Calgary as private in October 1914 and rose in the ranks to Lieutenant. He died of wounds received in action on Nov. 8, 1917, aged 28 years.



**Sergt. Caldwell A. Marshall**

Son of Mrs R Marshall, Durham, who enlisted in the 71st batt. in Sept 1915 and was killed in action Nov 18th, 1916, aged 22 years.



**Pte. Jas. G. Coutts**

Youngest son of Mrs. John Coutts, Brimley, killed in action Aug. 15, 1917, aged 22 years. He enlisted in Toronto Oct. 15, 1915.



**Pte. Alister Lauder**

Youngest son of Mr. Wm. Lauder, Durham, killed in action, October 26, 1917, aged 20 years. Enlisted in Jan. 1916, with 147th batt.



**Lieut. Thos. A. Allan**

Younger son of the late Wm. Allan, Egremont, killed in action, August 8th, 1915, aged 28 years. Enlisted in the 147th Grey batt. as Lieut. in November 1915.



**Pte. Arch. A. McKinnon**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Farquhar McKinnon, Priceville, killed in action Nov. 6th, 1917, aged 23 years. He enlisted in Melfort, Sask., Jan. 3, 1916 in the 188th batt.



**Pte. Thos. Mather**

(Sitting) younger son of Mrs. J. Mather Priceville, killed in action, Oct. 26th, 1917, aged 20 years. Enlisted in Oct. 1915, with 147th battalion. Standing beside him is Pte. J. Weir, North Egremont, who has returned.



**Pte. Robt. E. McLean**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. D. G. McLean, Priceville, wounded Sept. 29th, 1918, and died of wounds the following day, aged 22 years. He enlisted in a Winnipeg battalion early in 1916.



**Sergt. Donald McK**

Son of Mr and Mrs Neil McK Toronto, formerly of Priceville on Sept. 10th and died Sept. 10th, aged 24 years. He enlisted in



**Pte. J. R. McDonald**

Son of the late Hugh McDonald, line, Gleneg, killed in action on Ridge, April 1917, aged 37 years



**Pte. Rich. Wailing**

Of Egremont, wounded Aug. 9th, and died of wounds on Aug. 12th, 1918. Enlisted in Dec. 1915 in 147th batt.
