JOYOUS CROWD FILLED STREETS OF BRITISH CAPITAL.

King and Queen Took Part in Rejoicings of Throngs That Surrounded Buckingham Palace.

The official seal was set on the report of the signing of peace by the booming of guns, says a London despatch. The West End was filled with joyous crewds, but the rejoicings fell far below those witnessed on armistice

FIRST AID TO A FRIEND.

How One Dog Showed Intelligent Af-

fection in Ministering to Another. A Princeton man who is fond of horses and dogs, says a writer, owns a finely bred hunting dog, which he missed for several days.
