Ripon, July 14, 1919 The devil and Cromwell figure in many of their legendary tales and hatred to each is equally intense: the devil is blamed for poor harvests and sicknesses and Cromwell is cursed roundly for the cruelty and havoc he wreaked upon the south over two hundred and fifty years ago.

But strange as these stories appeared to us, the general every day life of the people surprised us. Here in Killarney the primitive Irish race greets you. You have heard of such conditions before but you scarcely realized them.

Men drive about in their grotesque donkey carts in most amazing fashion and market day finds College St., Killarney, a congested mass of donkey traffic.

The tourist to Killarney naturally takes in the fine trip through the gap of Dunloe and the 14-mile boat trip over the three lakes.

Cork was our next stopping place. It is a very nice city of about 75,000 population, though it is similar to other Irish cities and has great many unemployed or what I think is nearer the mark, people who belong to the "I-won't-work" society.

Six miles from Cork is Blarney Castle and the famous Blarney Stone. The Castle is a very high one and to reach the Stone you climb a very narrow stair, case to a height of almost 200 feet, lie on your back, lean out over the wall and commit the deed of kissing a none too sanitary piece of cold lifeless stone.
