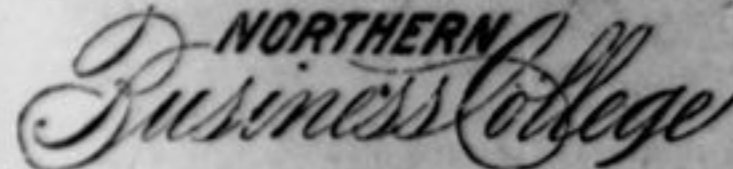

Heavy Gas Flow Struck in Flesherston

In the drilling operations on what is known as the Henderson and Midland well, on the McTavish farm within the village limits, a heavy flow of natural gas was struck the fore part of last week, as well as a quantity of oil. The flow of gas is quite heavy, but the pressure has not been gauged. A pipe rises some thirty feet from the ground and when the Advance man visited the well the roar of the gas from this pipe reminded one of an aeroplane passing over, and the gas as it left the pipe could be distinctly seen by the eye - or perhaps, to be more accurate, the disturbance of the air at the point of exit could be distinctly seen. The flow of gas was struck at a depth of about 1850 feet. Drilling operations are being continued this week. - Advance.

Four Year Sentence for Holley

Adam Holley of Dornoch was sentenced to four years in the Kingston penitentiary on Saturday. The sentence was on a charge of arson, and another charge of perjury was left over until the next session of the assizes. A feature of the case was that the crown brought Holley's three sons all the way from Grand Prairie, Man to testify against their father.

For a number of years there had been bad blood between Holley and W. J. Bell, who lived on the adjoining farm. In 1909 Holley had Bell convicted for stealing chickens, and the charge of perjury was laid against Holley on the ground that he falsely swore that he saw Bell taking the chickens. Then in October, 1915, Bell's barn was burned, and Holley's sons saw their father

returning home across the fields just as the fire broke out. A detecti had been working on the case for some time, and it was for setting fire to the barn that Holley was sent down to Kingston. In sentencing him Mr Justice Lennox said that Holley had been a harsh and domineering man, too prone to have his own way, and had been too hard on his sons. The sentence was made light, as Holley is over sixty.
