And after exercise-or, better still as its partner-comes food. Food is literally the body's fuel, and creates heat. But all food does not create the same amount of heat. Some lower it. In winter, the heat-producing foods, like porridge, fat meat, dripping, stews, butter, bacon, pork, and oily fish-salmon, mullet, etc.-should be eaten. Slow mastication, plus exercise, will enable all these foods to digest easily and warm th body.

is a fallacy. True, weight makes us pening is that we are surrendering our body heat. Presently we shall be very cold. Winter clothes should be loose, so that the air buffer can form. Two thin vests, not close-fitting, are infinitely better than one thick one. Clothing, generally, should be of no heavier texture than will repel extra cold winds. All else is waste. The material should be wool, not because wool "makes you warm," but because it conserves the heat which radiates from your body.

The entrance of dirt into milk is objectionable from two standpoints, sanitary and economic. The contamination of milk by manure may add organisms which are injunious to
