CREW HUNG BY **ROPES FOR 5 HOURS** Survivor of Wrecked Vessel Tells of Terrible Experience.

A despatch from Charlottetown says:-After a miraculous escape from death when the new three-masted schooner "Barbara MacDonald" was dashed to pleces on Cape Pine, on the rockbound coast of Newfoundland, Hon. J. A. MacDonald, of Cardigan, P.E.I., the owner of the vessel, and surviving members of the crew reached the island on Christmas eve. Mac-Donald tells a thrilling tale of suffering and hardship, and what he regards as providential intervention, for on this section of the coast, the scene of past disasters, no other ship-wrecked crew has ever reached shore alive.




