How C.P.R. Engineer Won Victoria Cross.

It fell to the lot of a C.P.R. engineer Ite John Peter Robertson, to win the much coveted Victoria Cross at Passchendaele. Robertson enlisted at Lethbridge with the 175th and was an engineer on that division. He was better known as "Pete" to his Lethbridge friends. He was born in Pictou, Nova Scotia, but lived most of his life in Medicine Hat with his mother, Mrs. Alex. Robertson. Robertson was aged thirty-four, won

his distinction in connection with operations at Passchendaele, November 6, 1917. Details came through authoritative channels that during his battalion's attack Robertson's platoon was held up by uncut wire two hundred yards from the final objective. Our guns were still busy cutting a way through the wire when a German machine gun opened fire and inflicted very heavy losses on the Canadians. Robertson, without waiting for orders and entirely on his own initiative rushed towards the German gun, defy ing the machine gun's withering fire Moreover, our artillery barrage was so intense that death seemed almost certain. 


