Mr Thos McAllister went to Brantford Saturday last to attend the funeral of an uncle.

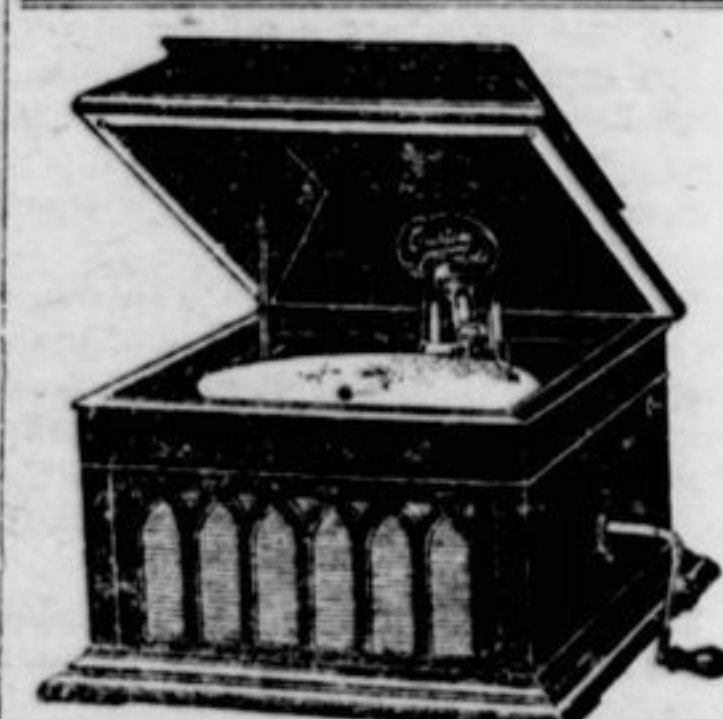
