They are quoted higher figures at every visit of the supply house men and now prices will soar in reality.

Printers are just in the same position as the buyers of Canadian commodities or manufacturers. They must go into the open market and compete with the buyers of the world for what they require in their business, consequently they must raise their prices for what they sell or become bankrupt and be forced out of business.

The weekly newspaper publisher there is only one course left in regard to subscription rates. He must raise to \$2 per year or play a losing game.—Paisley Advocate.

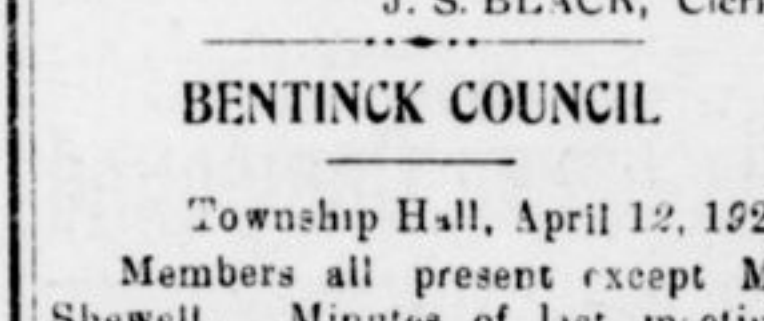
