There are now several methods sending pictures by telegraphy, and they have all one feature in common. A picture is transmitted, not as whole, but bit by bit. It is sent piece-People who laugh internally, with a meal from one end and built up in like manner at the other.

The main principles of picture-telegraphy are embodied in a system which was used experimentally a few which has a double motion-it both revolves and travels longitudinally. Every part of the picture can thus be brought ultimately to the same point.




