Trotzky are fighting a quiet and deadly battle for control, that there must be a break and that bolshevism will split into two or more factions. There is little evidence of this. Lenine emerges more and more as the stronger man of the Duumvirs, as the future dictator of another and still different Russia that may be even more dangerous to the world than the Russia of the Soviets.

Power seems to be passing more and more into the hands of Lenine. Trotzky appears less and less in the picture.
