A By Law Guaranteeing Debentures of Jackson Manufacturing Company of the Town of Durham.

WHEREAS Jackson Manufacturing Company are about to erect in the Town of Durham a Cabinet and Woodware Manufacturing Plant, and the cost thereof when fully completed with equipment and machinery will be the sum of Thirty-two Thousand Dollars. (\$32,000.00)

AND WHEREAS in order for the erection, completion and equipment of the said Woodware plant, it will be necessary for the said Jackson Manufacturing Company to borrow the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), which sum shall be applied to the completion, erection and equipment of said Woodware plant, and not otherwise, and more particularly set out in an agreement made privately between the Corporation and the said Company.

AND WHEREAS the said Jackson Manufacturing Company propose to issue debentures of the said Company to the amount of ten thousand Dollars, for the purposes aforesaid, and has applied to the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham, to guarantee the debentures of the said Jackson Manufacturing Company to the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars.

AND WHEREAS the said debentures of the Jackson Manufacturing Company will sell more readily if guaranteed by the said Corporation of the Town of Durham, and the said Municipal Council in view of the circumstances, and the benefit likely to accrue to the said Municipality from the erection of the said Jackson Manufacturing Woodware plant, deem it expedient to guarantee the due payment of the said debentures upon maturity thereof respectively.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality is One Hundred and Thirteen thousand Six Hundred and Twenty Two Dollars and Eighty-three cents, (\$13,622.83), whereby no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, and it is hereby enacted as follows:

1. That the said Corporation of the Town of Durham do hereby guarantee the due payment of the debentures of the said Jackson Manufacturing Company to the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to be issued as aforesaid according to the terms of the said debentures.

The Mayor of the said Town of Durham is hereby authorized and directed to sign the said guarantee on each of the said debentures on behalf of the said Corporation of the Town of Durham, and the Clerk of the said Corporation is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same respectively and to affix the Corporate Seal of the Corporation of the Town of Durham.

5. When so signed, the said Corporation of the Town of Durham shall be liable on default, in the payment of the said debentures by the Jackson Manufacturing Company to the holder or holders of the said debentures and responsible for the due payment thereof at the time and place named therein respectively.

6. The said debentures shall be dated and issued all at one time, and shall be payable in twenty instalments during the twenty years next after the date thereof and the respective amounts of principal and interest payable during each year shall be as follows:-
