He left Mme. Gagelin to start for himself and took a flat in the Rue de la Paix, where his firm is still situated At that time-during the Second Empire-it was a fashionable residential street, and the inhabitants objected to the presence of a business man-among them. The Empress Eugenie took an interest in the young man and helped to make his fortune. Besides his designs, his particular contribution to the business of dressmaking was to introduce the modern custom of the dressmaker's supplying the materials as well as cutting and making them up. Before his time women of all ranks chose their stuffs themselves at the silk merchants' or the linen drapers'. On his death his business descended to his sons, and it is a grandson that is now at the head of the
