I means that 480 acres of land have to be reclaimed from the sea, and made fit for the building of a new seaport.

## Mothering the Majestic.

The docks have been planned to take the largest vessel ever likely to be built, and a new floating dock is to be built which will pick up the 56,000 ton Majestic out of the sea as if she were a cork. This dock alone is costing more than a million to build.

The five great piers which are to be the berths of these floating towns are to be similar to those of New York. only much finer and longer. They will face oceanwards, so as to give the greatest convenience to the incoming ships. Behind these piers new railway lines are to be constructed to join up all the main routes to every part of the country. Industrially, the new town will be a wonder. Immediately behind the landing piers factories on a colossal scale are to be built, to manufacture goods for all parts of the


