Sunday last in fine weather, probably 5000 people witnessed the unveiling of the Soldiers' Memorial monument by Lieut. Governor Cockshutt in the Factory town.

The proceedings began by a procession of school children, Girl Guides, Boy Scouts and a platoon of veterans.
