bering is shown by recent statistics of the British Columbia Manufacturers Association. According to these figures the volume of business of basic industries in the province last year was: Lumber, \$64,970,000; agriculture, \$60,065,000; mining, \$23,066,641; fishing, \$22,329,000; other industries, \$58,-




