Care of the Cyclamen.

potting, the plant may be brought into a trial. Cyclamen leaves should be washed frequently with a damp cloth and all red spiders destroyed as soon as they appear. Greenhouse plants often have the tiny white millers which are very bad for cyclamen. Put some am-

monia in a saucer and set plant in that if it is troubled with millers. Begin to water them as soon as brought to the sunlight, but do not keep them wet. Water them frequently and let them be quite dry before watering again. The amount of water used will depend greatly upon the humidity of the room.

Odorless Cabbage.

Few realize, except by odor, that the aristocratic cauliflower and Brussels sprouts belong to the same family as the plebeian cabbage. Unfortunately, there is no vegetable more maligned than the cabbage, which bears out the old adage, "Give a dog

a bad name and it will stick to him." This same bad name is due largely to its manner of cooking, and the very strong and unpleasant odor which it imparts while cooking, when in reality, if rightly prepared, there need be little or no odor and the finished product will be as delicate and delightful as the far higher-priced cauliflower.
