# The Review.

## Dr. Jamieson's Official Majority 314

The elections of 1923 are now a matter of history, and once again the riding of South Grey is represented by the Hon. Dr. Jamieson. His defeat in 1919 by Dr. Leeson, who won out with a majority of 308, was not regarded seriously as a permanent defeat and the result of the polls on Monday, when Dr. Jamieson was again returned the winner by 314, is a notable feature of the strength of the statement often uttered that he is put back there to a large extent by the voters who rejected him four years ago. While the majorities in the towns and villages, with the exception of Flesherton, were larger than in 1919, the slump in the support to Dr. Leeson is really the cause of his defeat. The unfulfilled promises of the Drury administration were undoubtedly a strong factor in the defeat of the U. F. O. standard-bearer. Below we give a tabulated statement of the result of the polling as received last night over the telephone from M. E. Murray, Returning Officer. For the sake of comparison, we give both the figures of 1919 and 1923:
