Farewell to Rev. C. S. Jones

Large congregations assembled morning and evening on Sunday last in St. Columba Church, Priceville, the occasion being the last services of Rev. C. S. Jones, who has been their minister and also of St. Andrew's Swinton Park, for the past four years and four months. At both services he made kindly references to the harmonious relations that had existed between them and also to the friendly spirit that had always existed with the sister church there. His evening discourse was founded on the 11th chap. of Hebrews, "That they without us should not be made perfect." He had much to say by way of illustration of the heritage handed down to us by the pioneers. Their faith and courage in establishing schools and churches amid physical difficulties neither few nor small, was in a sense perfected in us. The duty rested on us to see that the benefits of the foundations thus laid should be passed on to our successors, and he made admirable use of Col. McCrae's lines, "In Flanders' Fields: To you from falling hands we throw the torch, be yours to hold it high." This was the gist of his parting message, to "pass it on."

Monday evening, a farewell gathering of another nature took place and kindly feelings found vent in many kind words, accompanied by a well-filled purse to Mr. Jones and a Life Membership Certificate in the W. M. S. to Mrs Jones in recognition of her warm interest in Mission work.
