



### FORT WELLINGTON MILITARY CENTRE

RELIC OF EARLY CANA-DIAN HISTORY.

Restoration of Historic Blockhouse at Prescott Completed by Department of Interior.

On the recommendation of the Historic Sites and Monuments Board of Canada restoration work on Fort Wellington, Prescott, Ontario, has been undertaken and completed by the Canadian National Parks Branch of the Department of the Interior. It is the intention of the branch now to erect a bronze tablet bearing record of the salient facts in the history of the fort. The old fort is connected with the stirring and romantic events of the war of 1812, and especially with the capture of Ogdensburg by Colonel MacDonell and his Glengarry men.
