Surnames and Their Origin

BOYLE Variations—O'Boyle, Boghill, Hill. Racial Origin—Irish. Source—A given name.

These family names are anglicized forms of another of the Irish clan names, though, of course, the one variation, Hill, has an English origin.

The Irish form of the name is "O'Booghall," which isn't half as hard to pronounce as it looks when it is considered that the "gh" in this case happens to be virtually silent.

The less frequent form, "Boghill," has no connection whatever with the English words, "hog" and "hill."

In turn there are cases on record where families bearing this name have arbitrarily shortened it still further to "Hill" in the effort to obscure its Irish origin.

The clan traces its origin to a chief-tan of the O'Donnells of Tyrconnell, whose given name was "Boaghall."

MACKIN. Variations—MacMackin, Meekins, Mackin, Meskin. Racial Origin—English, also Scottish. Source—A given name.

There is a peculiar parallelism of the forms of the English and Scottish family names in this group, which have come from the same given name, but through a different form of development.

The given name, though you might not suspect it, is Matthew, the same that has given us the family names in the Mathewson and Matheson classifications.

The change from the "ch" in Matthew to a "ck" or "k" in English was brought about as the result of the use of one of the Anglo-Saxon diminutives of the name. "Matkin" was a short form of Matthew, "Matkin," through the addition of the diminutive ending "kin," meant "Little Mat." Hence the meaning of Matkinson is clear.

The development of the Scottish name is somewhat different. One of the older forms of the Gaelic "MacMhathain" (Mathewson), was "MacMaghain," met with about 1263, and it is from this form that MacMackin is developed.

Words With Changed Meanings.

If we wish to label anything strange or barbarous we say it is "outlandish," but when the Bible speaks of an "outlandish woman" it means a foreigner.

Another curious expression in the Authorized Version is "The other basket had very naughty figs." That means fruit which was good for naught.
