

One of the racing craft now being built secretly is the development of a type which, during "hush, hush" trials last autumn, attained a speed of 215 miles an hour with the throttle not fully open.

With a very small span, and streamlined so that there are no "bumps" in the fuselage, this racer, which will be equipped with floats for landing on water, will look like a flying bullet as it goes hurtling through the air.

One of the secrets of its speed will be the specially constructed engine. let into the fuselage to minimize wind resistance.


