One of the references is in Second Samuel, where we are told that David. after having occupied the stronghold of Zion, "built round about, from Millo and inward." In the First Book of Kings, however, we are told specifically that it was Solomon who built Millo. and in the twenty-seventh verse of the eleventh chapter the statement is

"Solomon built Millo and repaired the breaches of the city of David his father."

Professor Macalister indicates the utmost precise correspondence of the literary material with the archaeological evidence still in the ground. "We should find a fortiess built, to fill a breach in the wall, and we have found it. That tower should show signs of a later repair under stress of imminent danger, and it does. There should be a fortification wall built "inward from" the tower, and there is. There should be no conspicuous fortification here earlier than the time of Solomon, and there is not. Absolutely everything that we know about Millo-except the murder of Joash, which could hardly be expected to leave recognizable traces-is reflected in the structures which have now passed under the reader's eye. In the absence of inscriptions, none of which have come to light, I venture to say that these coincidences constitute the strongest possible argument in favor of the claim that Millo has been discovered, and a hitherto unsolved problem of the topography of Jerusalem in the early one makes a delicious brew, the other days of its history settled."
