Meaford Boy Won Scholarship. The Ontario Dept. of Education has announced the winners of the J. I. Carter Scholarships in the various counties eligible to compete, and the 1st Scholarship for Grey as a result of his standing in the June Upper School examinations goes to Mr. John Laing of Meaford High School, son of Rev. A. Laing, formerly of Thornbury, but now of Sundridge, Ont. The Carter Scholarships are awarded to the three candidates obtaining the highest marks on no more than ten papers in the 1925 June Upper School examinations in Toronto and twenty four counties. \$100 in cash goes to the winner of the first prize; \$60 to the 2nd and \$40 to the 3rd. The second and third prizes in Grey Co. were won by students at Owen Sound College.
