An equally effective remody is that of fall plowing. By this means the young larvae, which usually hatch in August and September, are exposed to severe winter weather. The following spring those which survived the winter find less material to feed on and many of them die from starvation. Sci's that tend to "run together" mu usua y be plowed again the fol-lowing spring, unless the surface of the plowed ground is very rough or the winter happens to be continuously cold and the spring thaw takes place quite rapidly. The French and Belgian farmers prefer to plow the land again in the spring. For that remon they practice very shallow plowing in the fall to be followed by deep plowing before the crop is planted. Well-rotted manure is carefully spread over the land following the harvesting of the summer hay crop. The plowing is just deep enough to get this material cov-
