Heads off at Barrie

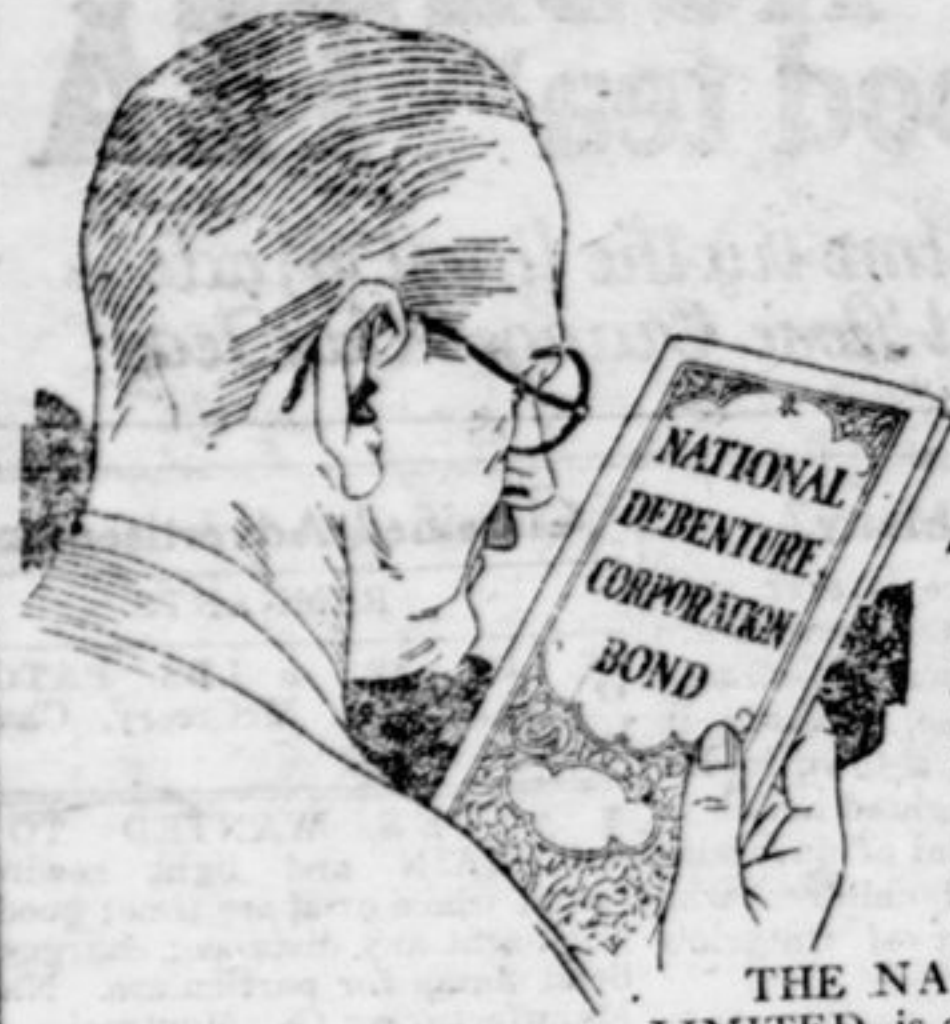
The Town Council of Barrie has decided that hereafter fowl sold on that market must go to the slaughter house and get their heads off.
