How to Eat Grapefruit.

"The name of the big cousin of the orange and lemon is a standing puzzle to many, for it is not related to the grape, it doesn't look like a grape, and there is nothing about its taste to suggest the flavour of a grape. But if you ever get a chance to see it growing in Florida or California, the puzzle is solved," says an American writer.

"Unlike virtually all other citrus fruits, the grapefruit globes appear in clusters of from six to a dozen, bending down the branches on which they grow, and looking rather like bunches of pale yellow grapes multiplied about fifteen or twenty diameters. There is only one proper way to cut grapefruit, and that is to cut it as little as possible, and then only the

moment before you eat it. "The bitter taste that makes a half-grapefruit unpalatable, if it is allowed to stand for any length of time, resides in the 'rag,' the white auff that makes up the central column and the lining and the partitions between the sections of the fruit. The more this is cut the more of the bitter principle is released into the juice. Grapefruit should be chilled whole, cut in two with a sharp knife immediately before service, relieved of its seeds with a fork, and then hurried to the table. Handling in this way will in most cases obviate the necessity of using sugar and thus enable one better to enjoy the real grapefruit flavor."




