# ARMY AVIATORS FETED IN HAWAII

### Maitland and Hegenberger Will Leave Monoplane and Return by Ship

Honolulu.—Lieuts. Lester J. Maitland and Albert Hegenberger, who landed near here after their flight from Oakland, Calif., over 2400 miles of the Pacific Ocean, are planning to leave for San Francisco on the steamer Maui.

The stunt Fokker monoplane, which made the longest flight over water, will be left in Hawaii for interstalar flying by army aviators.

The love of the aviator for his airplane, like the traditional love of the sailor for his ship, was proved when Maitland and Hegenberger visited the great monoplane which bore them in nearly 100 miles an hour in the history-making flight of 25 hours and 50 minutes.

With only a couple of hours for rest, the flyers were out for a plunge in the sea. Afterward began a long list of social affairs where tribute was paid them for their exploit.

They called upon Maj.-Gen. Edward M. Lewis, commanding the Hawaiian department of the army; upon Rear Admiral John McDonald and upon Gen. Wallace R. Farrington. Later they were guests at a community luncheon.

A dinner at the home of Col. John P. Howard, department air officer, and a public reception at 9 o'clock was the evening program arranged for the flyers.

Maitland told the story of his flight over again, but this time he told it in four sentences, punctuated with smiles.

# The Feeding and Protection of Shade Trees

That trees, contrary to the opinion of the average individual who feels that they are one thing at least which can safely be left to nature, require almost as much attention and care to obtain a maximum growth as flowers.

Trees that are planted under optimum conditions, and properly fed and watered, more than repay the care and attention given them, and are much more able to withstand insect pests and fungus diseases than those which have been neglected and whose vitality in consequence is considerably lessened.

Trees can only take their nourishment in the form of liquid or gases. The placing of a fertilizer on the soil does not mean that the tree absorbs nourishment from it in the same manner that we should obtain nourishment from, say, a beefsteak. The ingredients in the fertilizer become available only when dissolved in moisture.

In order to obtain the best results from the feeding of trees, it is well to remember that the fine root hairs which absorb the nourishment from the soil are not near the trunk, but are at the ends of the root system.

This system invariably extends in the ground slightly further than the branches extend in the air, therefore the fertilizer must be placed in an accessible position. An imaginary circle should be drawn on the ground under the outermost edges of the branches and a number of holes bored with a crowbar to a depth of eighteen inches, about two feet apart.

One thing that may cause an otherwise healthy tree to die is regarding the land. If the ground near an old tree is filled in to a depth of several inches it changes the amount of air supply to the old soil surfaces, and the amount and character of the microbe life which has been functioning there for the benefit of the plant roots.
