

Striking Rise in Trade Figures

Canada Shows

Commerce With the United States Makes 24-Fold Gain Since Confederation

Ottawa-The amazing growth o Canadian trade with the United States during the 60 years which have elapsed since confederation is graphically revealed in statistics just issued by the trade and commerce depart ment of the Federal Government Canada is celebrating the dismond jubilee of confederation and the report on trade is compiled as part of the Government effort to set forth the progress since the Dominion was

The figures show that Canada's trade with the United States from confederation to 1927, increased from \$48,009,700 to \$1,167,039,699 or 24 times. The total trade in amounting to \$162,187,822, was only a trifle more than three times as great es that in 1868. From 1868 to 1900 Canada's total rtade with the United States increased \$114,173,122, or 238 per cent., while from 1969 to 1927 the lous. increase was \$858,240,829, or 497 per
