Tendencies in Farming

Hamilton Spectator (Ind. Conc.)-It is interesting to observe that twothirds of the total revenue of the English farmer is from his live stock, meat animals, dairy products, poultry, eggs and wool. With the Canadian farmer the value of this source of income is rising and now amounts to one-third of the total, which mean that for many eastern farmers it constitutes the main source of revenue Canadian dairy products now amount to \$250,000,000 a year, while live stock valued at over \$100,000,000 is annually sold, with poultry, eggs and wool running to approximately \$70,000,000 a year.
