

At present there are only about 12 good fishing harbors and 35 secondthough some hundreds of thousands of pounds have been spent on 300 other landing places, these are poorly equipped and usually far removed from the main line of transport. Fish is much more costly in Ireland than it is in the bfg inland towns of England, but the prices obtained by the fishermen are very small. This is partly due to the high freightage charges and slowness of transport, and high retail profits.

The methods of handling and packing the fish have also helped to depreciate the prices obtained by the fishermen. Very little care is taken in the way the fish is sorted and packed. Attempts are likely to be made to remedy this by educational courses in technical institutions founded in fishing districts.
